
For groups who embrace the outdoors, there's a famous surf beach nearby,

olorado is no stranger to destination weddings and domestic honeymoons, but the Rocky Mountains are seeing their share of overcrowding lately...unless you know where to look. If you love the rustic luxury of the Rockies, but seek a spot a little less traveled, then consider Crested Butte. Colorado. It's known as the Wildflower Capital of the state, making it a beautiful natural backdrop for a destination "I do." A short drive from Gunnison-Crested Butte Regional Airport (and four-plus hours from Denver), the small-town charm of this old mining village is ideal for groups who want to stroll down a historic main street and settle into a swanky, BBQ-style rehearsal dinner.

The big day could take place in the expansive surroundings or an intimate courtyard at Sopris House. For a buyout stay great for small groups, Scarp Ridge Lodge by Eleven Experience (sleeps 20) means living like you're in a posh hotel within the communal surroundings of a loved one's home. What was once the Croatian Hall where miners drank and danced, is now an ultra-luxurious boutique hotel offering inclusive adventures like snowcat skiing, guided hikes and ice climbing. If you want to get out in nature on wheels, then your group can enjoy the largest single track trail system in the U.S. for mountain bikes. Or you can paddle board down the river and then stroll into town for live music at Public House. On the other hand, you could hang in the indoor saltwater pool or fan-favorite rooftop Jacuzzi at Scarp Ridge Lodge and watch the stars (a must after all that exercise). Entry into this elevation will be a breeze with their oxygen-enriched air system and heated floors. But the best part is the great outdoors - with over 1,000 exclusive back acres for cat skiing in winter. Once you've tied the knot, let the honeymoon begin!

For unforgettable quality time with friends and family, no matter the season, consider taking your group to Crested Butte for a little old-fashion fun, combined with the all the modern luxuries your wedding deserves.

Making Music in

NASHVILLE, TENNESSEE

rom its wild guitar jams to honky-tonk nightlife, Nashville's a magnet for music fans. But the city attracts plenty of honeymooners and destination wedding couples, too. Aside from crazy good food (barbecue anyone?), the city has tons of hip neighborhoods overflowing with cafés, artist-run boutiques and sites to explore. There are fantastic museums, including the new National Museum of African American Music, and crowd-clapping bars where you can sway to the beat of country, jazz, pop and rock. Add parks for running and biking and a warm Southern spirit, and it's no wonder Tennessee's capital has become a hotspot for celebrating one's nuptials and saying, "I do."

One of the city's coolest hotels is Dream Nashville, nestled in two historic buildings in Printer's Alley, known for its nightlife. The hotel has 168 art deco-inspired rooms and suites, many outfitted with Turkish rugs and birch-wood closets. Perfect for newlyweds, the Guest House boasts 1,400 square-feet of room to stretch out overlooking the Cumberland River Basin. The furnishings are plush and the suite comes with unique amenities such as Dream's custom "Printer's Abbey" brew on tap and a combo dining room-ping pong table. Another luxurious option is the Terrace Suite, outfitted with an outdoor grill and an optional BBQ Butler on call. For wedding couples, both rooms offer snazzy spaces for cocktails or even an intimate rehearsal dinner.

Whatever you do, don't miss the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum. It tells the history of country music from its origins to today and then dives deeper with various temporary exhibits. For an added fee, you can tour Historic RCA Studio B, where legends like Dolly Parton and Elvis recorded their soon-to-be hits.

Once the sun goes down, head to lower Broadway, packed with honkytonk bars. Locals love the quality gigs at Acme Feed & Seed and Tootsies Orchid Lounge, circa 1960. The Ryman Auditorium features big-wigs like Keith



Urban, while the Grand Ole Opry is a live country music stage concert that has been broadcast weekly on the radio since 1925. Call ahead for tickets.

No trip to Nashville is complete without BBQ and some of the best comes from Martin's Bar-B-Que Joint, which slow-roasts whole hogs for their signature pork dishes. Rolf and Daughters serves standout locavore fare, like rigatoni with heritage pork ragu, while Lockeland Table excels in Southern specialties, like grilled fish with cheesy grits. Want to splurge? The Catbird Seat has hyper-seasonal tasting menus and Yolan inside The Joseph Hotel serves refined Italian fare.

For sheer fun, visit Pinewood, a mash-up restaurant, cocktail lounge, bowling alley and pool. Also, check out Justin Timberlake's new, multi-level lounge, bar and restaurant, The Twelve Thirty Club. Newcomers Tennessee Brew Works has live music and Assembly Food Hall dishes up everything from homemade doughnuts to pad thai.

In many ways, Nashville is like a neverending party with endless things to see, do and taste. Know that whatever you miss this time around, you can save for an anniversary visit.






















Three Ways to Tie the Knot in

If you think you know West Virginia, think again. The Mountain State is rugged and diverse; home to charming small towns, world-class outdoor adventure, and one of the country's most famous resorts. Here are three ways to approach tying the knot in southern West Virginia, whatever your wedding style.

FOR THE TRADITIONALISTS: THE GREENBRIER

Resorts don't get much more classic than The Greenbrier. It dates to the 1770s, when vacationers first came to this valley to soak in the waters of White Sulphur Springs. Those humble beginnings have grown into an Old-World hotel with glorious common spaces, historic cottages and 700-plus rooms.

Ceremony and reception: A property this size has loads of options, with ballrooms, flagstone patios, off-site lodges and a hunting club. But for the classic Greenbrier experience, swap vows in the white clapboard chapel with its stained-glass windows and a coppertopped steeple. The curved Chesapeake Terrace and adjacent Chesapeake Bay ballroom are ideal for indoor-outdoor receptions, while the elegant, pink-andgold Cameo Room is a showstopper year-round.

Group bonding: Spa days and golf scrambles are easily arranged, but for something different, take over the bowling alley, go geocaching, or puzzle your way out of the *Titanic*-themed escape room.

FOR THE OUTDOORSY: ADVENTURES ON THE GORGE

Kick off your new life together at our nation's newest national park, New River Gorge National Park and Preserve. The river cuts a deep canyon through the Appalachian Mountains and Adventures on the Gorge near Fayetteville is the perfect base camp. With lodging options from luxury homes to comfy cabins and even tent and RV sites, there's something for every budget.

Ceremony and reception: You want a venue that takes in the epic scenery and the wooden Ceremony Deck delivers. It was purpose-built for events, overlooking the woods and the gorge beyond. Then move into the timber-frame Smokey's for dinner and dancing, while a bluegrass trio adds the sound of Appalachia.

Group outings: The New River is one of the world's top whitewater rafting spots and guests can try it by comfort level. For a different adrenaline rush, tether up for the Bridge Walk, which takes you across the catwalk beneath the iconic New River Gorge Bridge.

FOR FOODIES: GENERAL LEWIS INN

Living up to its reputation as "America's Coolest Small Town," Lewisburg combines a thriving food scene with easy access to the outdoors. The historic General Lewis Inn is a 24-room boutique hotel located just a block up the hill from the heart of downtown, so guests can leave their cars and wander the shops, galleries and eateries downtown with minimal effort.

Ceremony and reception: The inn's owners, who wed at the General Lewis five years before buying it, deliver with a gorgeous back garden that easily transforms into a wedding venue. Retreat a few steps down for cocktail hour on the patio, and then do dinner and dancing under a marquee tent, or indoors in the historic Dining Room. The setting is historic, but their approach to food and drink is modern.

Group bonding: Tell your guests to bring their appetites, because there are plenty of places to sate them. Set up a welcome dinner at Stardust Café, known for fantastic housemade pastas, or get a taste of Europe at The French Goat, which puts a twist on classic bistro ingredients. Want something more spirited? Hire a driver for a boozy tasting tour.


